Background


Picture Butte Emergency Services is a branch of the Town of Picture Butte providing fire, rescue, emergency medical, and now bylaw enforcement with the creation of the municipal enforcement division. Picture Butte Emergency Services also has contracts with Lethbridge County and Alberta Health Services to provide fire, rescue, and emergency medical services to surrounding area.

Most Important Asset

Picture Butte Emergency Services is comprised of 3 full-time, 2 part-time, and 20 volunteer staff members, who logged a total of **2186** volunteer hours responding to emergencies.







Picture Butte Emergency Services operates a Basic Life Support (BLS) ambulance staffed by Primary Care Paramedics (EMTs) and Emergency Medical Responders (EMRs). The unit is staffed Monday to Friday 7:00 am to 7:00 pm by full-time and part-time staff with night shifts and weekends covered by paid-on-call staff.



Fire / Rescue Services

Picture Butte Emergency Services responded to a total of 246 fire events in 2019. Firefighters provide fire suppression, rescue, and hazardous materials response services in addition to the medical first-response (MFR) program which provides assistance to the ambulance or responds to medical events during a code red.



Volunteers performed 2372 hours of training in 2019!



Did you know?

All Picture Butte firefighters are medically-trained with most being certified PCPs.





Bylaw Services

This past year, Picture Butte Town Council ended the agreement with Coaldale & District Municipal Enforcement in favour of creating our own enforcement division. The Town of Picture Butte provides bylaw enforcement services with a part-time staff member who works a rotating shift schedule. With our officer joining the team in November, after orientation, his focus has been on enforcing snow removal through the *Unsightly Premises Bylaw #797-06*.



Municipal Enforcement Officer Brayden Fenz joined Picture Butte Emergency Services in November 2019.

Emergency Management (Disaster Services)

In December of 2019, Picture Butte Town Council updated our *Municipal Emergency Management Bylaw #889-19* to reflect the changes of the new provincial *Emergency Management Act*. This past year brought a tremendous amount of quality disaster management training which will be continued and expanded throughout our organization.



Picture Butte is a membercommunity of a provincial all-hazard incident management team known as Alberta Task Force 3. Members committed over 100 hours of training in 2019 to better prepare of our community for the next disaster.
