Coaldale's Quincy Neufeld semifinalist in essay competition

Coaldale's Quincy Neufeld is off to Toronto this week to participate with 49 other hopefuls to win \$20,000.

No, he's not qualified for the Canadian version of Who Wants To Be A Millionaire, but he was chosen from more than 500 applicants across Canada to participate in Magna International's 2000 As Prime Minister Awards.

The select group of post-secondary students responded to the essay question "If you were the Prime Minister of Canada, what political vision would you

offer to improve the living standards of Canadians?"

The 21-year-old says his 3,000-word essay focused on a number of ideas such as holding annual town hall forums throughout Canada.

Neufeld also supports the concept of tax incentives for businesses which would donate to a pool of funds to be distributed to those in need, and development of an economic branch to research trends for farming and small businesses which would provide them with tax incentives.

Turin girl battles E. coli

The parents of a six-year-old Turin girl still being monitored for the effects of a battle with the E. coli bacteria may never know the source of her illness.

Linda Vogel said her daughter Caylee is being carefully watched to determine if she will react to toxins produced by the E. coli bacteria. After a few days in the hospital she was allowed to go home with a list of instructions for her parents to follow.

"She's not out of the woods yet," said Linda.

Caylee is feeling better than she was a week ago when she began suffering abdominal pains and bloody diarrhea. She is still weak and must take time out for rest breaks.

Linda said she still has some pain but it is not enough that she has to lay down.

She remains on a restricted gastro light diet which means no sugar, no fruit juice and no dairy products. She must also be tested every few days to determine that her kidney function is not elevated.

"Every day you wake up and hope this isn't the day," said Linda.

It will still be another week before doctors will say her daughter is cleared of the effects of the bacteria which gives off toxins that can lead to kidney failure and even death in small children. She said there is a five to 10 per cent chance Caylee could react to the toxins, and even with the number that low she'd be a lot happier if it was zero.

Linda said the watching and waiting is the hardest. She is on an emotional roller coaster but has to stay upbeat for Caylee and her three other children.

Quincy off to national competition

"Quincy's essay is an excellent example of the vision, courage and solutions that our students can offer Canada. He has an obvious commitment to his future in this country," said George Marsland, executive director of the scholarship fund.

The 50 semifinalists each won \$500 and will present their ideas before a national judging panel which includes television journalist Mike Duffy and print journalist Linda Frum of the National Post.

"Friday I will give a 20-minute speech about my essay and will be evaluated on my grades, the essay and speaking ability. I'm

really looking forward to it. It should be a lot of fun," Neufeld said.

From the 50 students who qualified as semifinalists, 10 will be chosen to move into the finalist round. Each will receive \$10,000 and a four-month internship with Magna International Inc.

The national winner will be announced at an awards ceremony in Ottawa this fall, and will receive an additional \$10,000 in cash and a one-year paid internship at Magna.

Neufeld graduated from Kate Andrews high school in 1997, and completed his business administration diploma from the Lethbridge Community College

this spring.

While at LCC, Neufeld was the student representative on the college's board of governors.

He was also awarded two leadership awards and won the John Lockwood National Essay Competition for his essay entitled Depth in Diversity.

This fall Neufeld will attend Royal Roads University in Victoria where he is enrolled in the entrepreneurial management program.

"I'd like to be a business owner - that's what my education is gearing me for. I'd probably like to get into something that has to do with physical fitness or real estate," said Neufeld before leaving for Toronto.

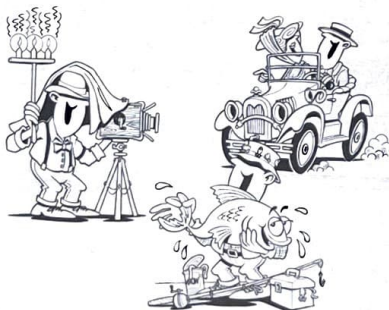

Decades of work create Priscilla's garden heaven

When Priscilla Sera moved to her farm in 1932, it was nothing but bald prairie with a small two-bedroom house, and loads of potential.

"There was nothing at all here. There wasn't even a tree or anything," recalls Sera.

It has taken years of hard work, but now the farm is surrounded by trees and about three quarters of an acre of garden.

The original homestead was owned by Sera's father and she and her husband John took over the farm in 1943. The farm is situated two miles west of Chin and six miles east of Coaldale and has undergone an amazing transformation over the past 60 or so years.

"I started in the late 1940s with trees, and with flowers in the 1950s. I used to lug the water with pails and then I had a hose. It was a continuous job and you don't mind it when you are younger and have your strength. I was often watering by hand until 11 o'clock at night."

Sera has spent countless hours watering her vegetable garden - which includes beets, carrots, parsnips, potatoes, peas, tomatoes, lettuce, cantaloupe and watermelon, as well as an arresting array of flowers such as phlox, peonies, lilies, canterbury bells, snapdragons, clematis, daisies, roses, geraniums, monkshood, maltese crosses, columbines, coral bells, and irises.

That exhaustive list of plants isn't anywhere near being complete. She has focused on perennials lately to help reduce the amount of work, but the garden still amounts to an ongoing labour of love.

"I'm no expert. I just putter with it. I get great satisfaction from it and I love doing it," Sera explains.

Her love for plants must cause them to multiply because her garden is flush with hundreds of the same variety, artistically grouped for maximum effect.

"I would guess I have maybe 80 peony bushes, maybe more. I'll have to count them sometime," she says with a laugh.

Sera's garden is so spectacular that it was a part of the garden tour for the Lethbridge and District Horticultural Society's annual parade in 1992, which drew about 300 people out to the farm.

"Actually it was quite nice - I really enjoyed it. I got number one for acreages and I've got quite a few red ribbons throughout the years."

As many gardeners will attest, the number and frequency of blooms on each plant depends solely on the year, and Sera finds this year far from the best growing season she's ever seen.

"It was tough in the 1930s - there was nothing here and it was so dry, just

like now - hot and dry."

The mother of seven children doesn't plant as many vegetables as she used to because she no longer has as many mouths to feed.

But she still bakes pies with apples from her own trees for her grandchildren.

And she no longer has to water her massive garden by hauling pails of

water, as a sprinkler system was installed about five years ago to help make the chore more enjoyable.

Sera says she spends all summer in her garden - she just comes indoors to cook - and can offer a little advice to those would-be gardeners.

"It's a lot of hard work and you have to love it. Talk to your flowers and they'll grow back for you."

For some, high school produced some of their best memories of growing up, while for others it may have been the most challenging moments of their lives which were played out at PBHS.

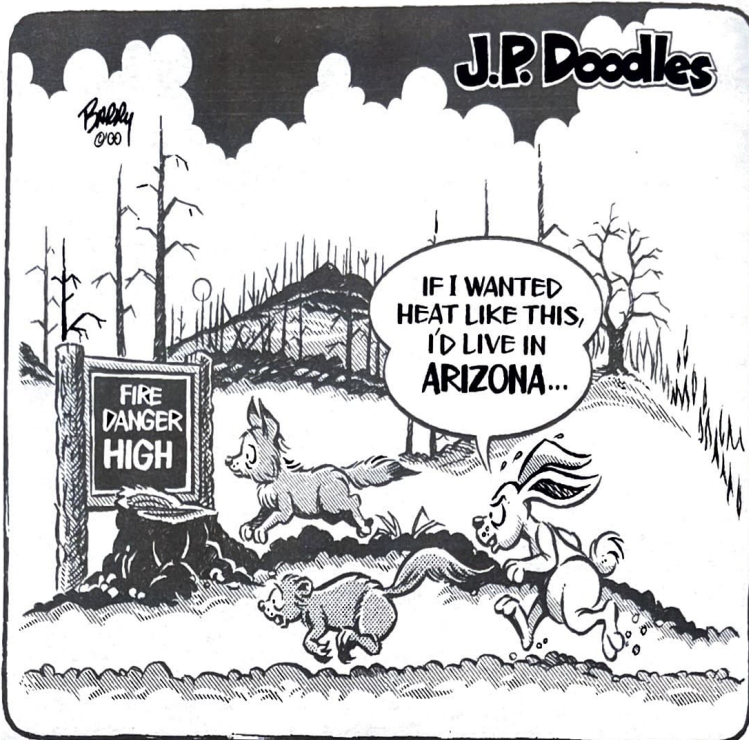

Good for Foremost folks

I was glad to see that the residents of the Foremost area had the self-respect to not take the Taiwan hog invasion lying down.

Hats off to the County of 40 Mile planning commission which must have done its homework. Congratulations to the people who signed the petition and to the people who worked so hard to get information to the public so that they could practise their democratic rights.

An 80,000-hog factory farm is like a nuclear plant. If everything goes perfectly, it is not too dangerous to our health. If it leaks, or is destroyed by a natural event, then life becomes hell as the toxic waste spills into the neighbourhood.

Having negatively affected the environment in Taiwan, the Taiwan Sugar Corporation decided it would look for unsuspecting people elsewhere, who might be desperate for jobs, and know nothing about the dangers of mega-concentrated animal feeding operations. The whole thing smacked of Third-World exploitation.

The Taiwan Sugar Corporation settled on Alberta because "they felt most comfortable with the officials in

government." What this means is that the provincial Conservatives encourage livestock expansion and have no desire to protect the public which must put up with these types of abominable animal feeding operations.

Our Alberta government lists

Alberta's advantages for hog farmers as low grain costs, minimal taxes, abundant land and few rules. One document even promises investors that, "once established, there is no government involvement in the normal day-to-day operations of the farm," and that the province, "will remove as many regulations as possible."

However, proper regulations along with ample public input would put people before profit, would protect our environment, and lessen the risk of neighbourhood conflict.

In a document called "A Review of the Development Proposal for a Farrow-to-Finish Hog Operation by the Taiwan Sugar Corporation In the County of Forty-mile, Alberta Canada," which you can find on the Internet, Dr. William J. Weida of the Department of Economics, Colorado College, Colorado

Springs, writes:

"Cost shifting occurs when the costs of health problems, traffic, social problems and pollution (odours, chemical and particulate air pollution; chemical, pathogen, and particulate water pollution) are transferred to the residents of a region and are neither paid by the company responsible for the costs nor included in the price of the products they market. Not paying the costs of responsibly handling its pollution in Taiwan has led to increasing criticism so TSC is moving its operations to a location where not handling its pollution responsibly will lead to less criticism. It should be noted that TSC had a clear alternative it chose not to exercise — it could have simply absorbed the costs of responsibly handling its pollution and stayed in Taiwan. The likely reason TSC chose not to take this option is that it would have reduced its profits."

Having said it would leave if the majority of residents did not want it, the Taiwan Sugar Corporation, no doubt encouraged by our own government which is supposed to look out for Albertans, not foreign multinationals, has appealed the County of 40 Mile's decision. The appeal will be held on Aug. 22 in Foremost.

Good luck folks; we hope you can fight it off once more.

Egg farm appeal hearing set

Another intensive livestock operation is now heading into an appeal hearing process, but this time the animals in question are chickens, instead of cows. Coaldale Egg Farm (1979) Ltd. is appealing a decision by Coaldale's municipal development authority which denied the business a development application.

The business was issued a stop order in June for using a mobile home on site as an office. The mobile home had initially been used as a residence and Coaldale Egg Farm (1979) Ltd. owner Amir Manji moved his office into the mobile home without applying to the town for a development permit.

The space that was created inside the barns by the business by moving the office to the mobile home site then was then reconverted to a refrigerated cold storage area for eggs, said town manager Sheldon Steinke.

When the business was annexed by the town in the 1980s, it was allowed to continue to operate as a non-conforming development. Under the Municipal Government Act, non-conforming buildings may not be enlarged or structurally altered.

The town then issued a stop order on the change in use of the barns, as it deemed the cold storage

area an expansion. The business hadn't applied for a development permit for the change in use, and the matter went to the municipal development authority meeting in mid July.

The board rejected the egg farm's application for a development permit on the grounds that an office is not considered to be similar to any permitted or discretionary uses listed within the urban reserve land use district.

The business is appealing the board's decision as it says the office use is consistent with the discretionary uses listed in the urban reserve land use district and the proposed development would not interfere with the enjoyment or value of neighbouring properties.

"The development authority ignored lack of objection from the neighbourhood and support from the neighbourhood in making their decision," said Wayne Peterson, lawyer for the egg farm.

The appeal hearing, which is open to the public, will be held at Coaldale's town office on Aug. 24 at 6 p.m. Arguments will be heard by a regional development board which includes one councillor each from Coaldale, Coalhurst, Picture Butte, Nobleford and Barons. The board has 14 days after the meeting to render its decision.

Anyone who will be affected by the change in the business's operation is welcome to submit a written presentation to the Town of Coaldale by Aug. 21.

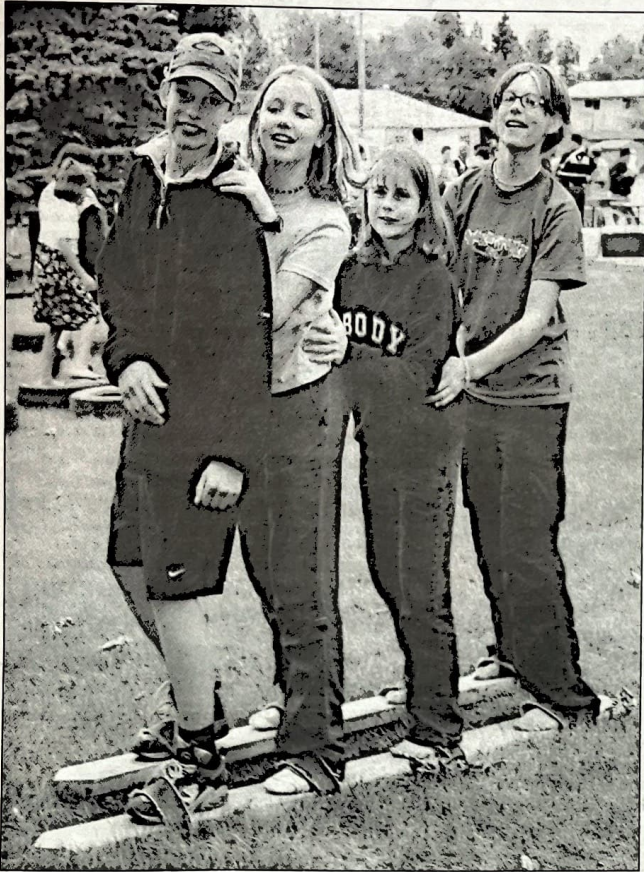

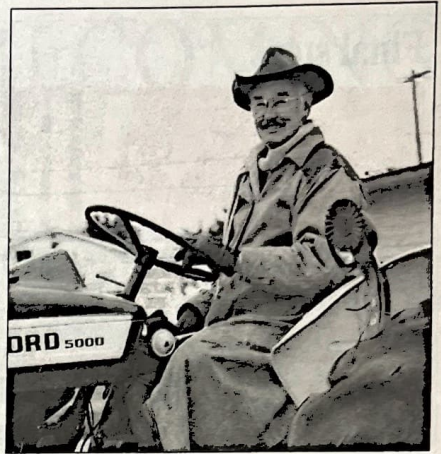

Olivers into third generation at Picture Butte high school

With her sights set on her senior year at Picture Butte high school, Nicole Oliver hasn't spent a lot of time thinking about her three-generation connection to the school.

Nicole, whose father Rob and her grandparents Necia and Duane all attended the school, said she never really thought about the history her family has in the school.

Her three older brothers have already graduated from the school and this fall she will share the school with three cousins.

Her uncle Mike is a teacher at the school and she says sometimes it's like being taught by her own father. She admits it feels odd to be going to the same school her aunt attended, as more than one teacher has mistakenly called her Michell.

She says it's a fun tradition to be going to the same school so many of her family attended. It almost feels like family to her being at school.

Her dad says his class was the first to go right through high school in the new building.

Rob says when he was president of the school council he found it weird to be working with principal Dennis King who was a football coach when he attended high school. He found himself still calling King "Mr. King."

"I had a lot of the teachers my parents had in school," he says.

When Necia and Duane were Grade 10 students Charles Allen was principal. He would later be Rob's social studies teacher. He says some of his former teachers also taught his kids. When they would come complaining to their parents about their teachers they didn't get a lot of sympathy.

He said attending a school his parents attended and now his kids have attended helps build a sense of ownership and pride in the school.

He feels more inclined to stand up when issues arise which threaten the future of the school.

"I don't feel I sacrificed anything going to PBHS," he says.

It was a good school for him and his children and even one day it may be the school some of his grandchildren attend.

"Over the years we've had excellent teachers," Rob says.

He says if a person looks around Picture Butte at the majority of people who contribute their time and talents to the community often it is those who have attended school here who really have a sense of community.

There is a connection built through attending school together. Even now when he walks into the building he feels like he's back in Grade 11, even if just for a

moment.

For Duane a lot of his school memories are wrapped up in the old student union building. It was the center of all socializing including dances, movies and lunch. The school had no running water and outdoor bathrooms. Necia recalls all too well the mice.

When they attended high school there were separate

entrances for the girls and the boys. No one went through the front doors; students just used their designated entrances.

Even today Duane says when he uses

the east door to enter the building he feels funny because that was the girls' entrance.

Tipping the principal's out-house was one of the activities he would like to forget.

The one time he and his buddies tried to tip it they were surprised to find the principal still inside. They took off running so fast they forgot about the page wire fence along the railroad tracks and ran right into it.

They managed to avoid getting caught and he never joined a tipping crew again.

"He sure scared the heck out of us. We never went back, I can tell you."

Necia says her graduating class, the Class of '52, had just nine graduates. It was the first year a dinner and dance was held to help celebrate the event.

It was also one of the first years the school produced a yearbook.

Duane says he has a lot of good memories of the school. His home room is now the same home room his son Mike teaches in.

He also has high praise for the

teachers who have taught over the last 50 years.

Necia says having three generations attending the school helps build the bonds between children and grandchildren.

They attended all of their children's activities and now they drop in at the school to see the games and activities their grandchildren are taking part in.

"It really strengthens family ties," she says.

She worked at the high school for a year and then spent 32 years working at Dorothy Dalgliesh school. She has seen not only her children and grandchildren move through the system but also the children and grandchildren of her classmates.

Duane says he is looking forward to meeting former schoolmates and friends at the anniversary activities.

They will also have a house full with their whole family taking part in the events.

Their daughter and her family will be back for the weekend from Edmonton and Necia's brother Bob Hage and his wife Delores (nee Salmon) are also making the trip from Yakama, Wash. to attend the reunion.

Duane's sister Sharon Buchanan is also coming from White City, Sask.

For the Olivers the reunion will be a chance to renew old friendships and share in a family tradition built at Picture Butte high school.

There are also a few other families taking part in the reunion who are also into their third generation including the Hannas, Hanays, Charlesworths, Reiters, Drakes, Reenders and Murrys, to name a few.

It's all over but the waiting. After more than a year of planning, organizers of the Picture Butte high school 50th anniversary and homecoming have just a few days to go before more than 1,500 former students, teachers and staff arrive in town.

The anniversary celebration begins Friday with registration and class reunions. Saturday attendees are invited to take part in Picture Butte's Jamboree Days activities. That afternoon there will be a variety program taking place in the recreation complex.

Saturday evening the reunion banquet will be held in the complex followed by a dance featuring Straight, Clean and Simple.

Volunteers have worked for several months to put the anniversary together. There was at least one person for each of the past 50 years in charge of locating classmates and their addresses. This information was entered into a data base and in January 3,600 invites were sent out with a questionnaire.

More than 1,500 people registered for the event and will be traveling mostly from around Alberta and the other Prairie provinces to take part in the weekend. There are also about 60 people coming from the United States, a couple from Australia and one from Singapore.

The 50th anniversary actually marks the 50th full year classes have been held at PBHS. In an effort to make the weekend a homecoming event for any and all former students the invitation list went as far back as 1926.

The first school in Picture Butte opened in 1926 in the Koepke's hall and post office. The first actual school building was erected behind the post office in the spring of 1927 and housed 30 pupils. The present site of the high school once housed four separate school buildings with a grade in each building from grades 9 to 12. Eventually the school site resembled a colony of schools.

Charmaine Sucher, who co-chairs the anniversary committee with Jeanene Casson, says despite the difficulty and glitches of organizing such a big event it has been fun to hear from the people who are so enthusiastic to attend.

"We know there are a lot of people looking forward to the event," she says.

The final week of preparation includes the double checking of the registration packets and preparing to welcome everyone back to PBHS. Sucher says she is hopeful the weather holds and everything runs smoothly.

The main goal of the anniversary is to give students, staff and teachers the chance to renew old friendships and catch up on each other's lives.

Casson says she is both nervous and excited.

"I'm shaking in my boots," she says.

She is excited to see so many former classmates but nervous for all the planning to come together. She says it's like a wedding, the last week is hairy.

All that is left to do now is to execute the plans and attend to the fine details which will ensure a great weekend for everyone involved. She has high praise for the numerous volunteers who have committed so much time to the anniversary.

PBHS reunion booklets cultivate memories

Participants in the Picture Butte high school 50th anniversary and homecoming celebration will be able to return to their homes with a unique reminder of the weekend's festivities.

A committee of volunteers has been hard at work for more than six months putting together reunion booklets. In all there are a dozen different books, one for staff, one for students from the 1920s, 30s and 40s and one for each five-year period from the 1940s to this year.

Included in the information that went out to potential attendees in January was a questionnaire with room for personal information and even a few lines to share a remembrance of attending school at PBHS.

Don Becklund floated the idea of a reunion booklet, noting Fonda Hanna was involved in the creation of a reunion book for her own class and reported it was well.

The reunion committee learned of a computer program designed for reunion planning which allowed for the entering of information that would then form a database.

Using this program Becklund said they were able to draft a questionnaire which has provided the information which forms the basis of each of the booklets.

The history of PBHS is the same in each of the 12 books. A flavour and spirit section is also the same and includes information gained from the registration forms.

Unique to each volume are the remembrances and anecdotes from the students or staff featured in the booklet. The final part of the booklet is an alphabetical directory of all of those who submitted their information for the books.

Each of the books also has pictures included. In the early years of the school there were no yearbooks published so Becklund said former students were asked to submit pictures. In later volumes class pictures and indi-

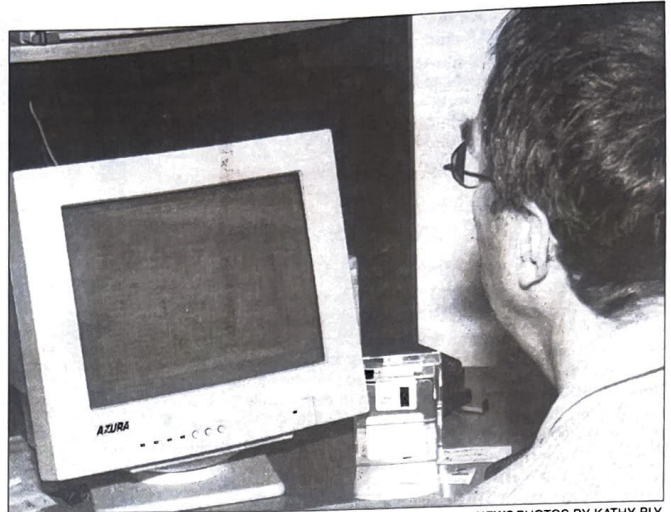
vidual shots were selected from the yearbooks.

Becklund said he can't say enough about all the work that went into identifying people in the pictures. A number of the people who submitted pictures also provided the names to identify those in the pictures.

The committee's goal was to have the booklets completed to hand out at the anniversary instead of producing the book after the fact. They are already anticipating a second run and are awaiting final orders to determine what the print job will be.

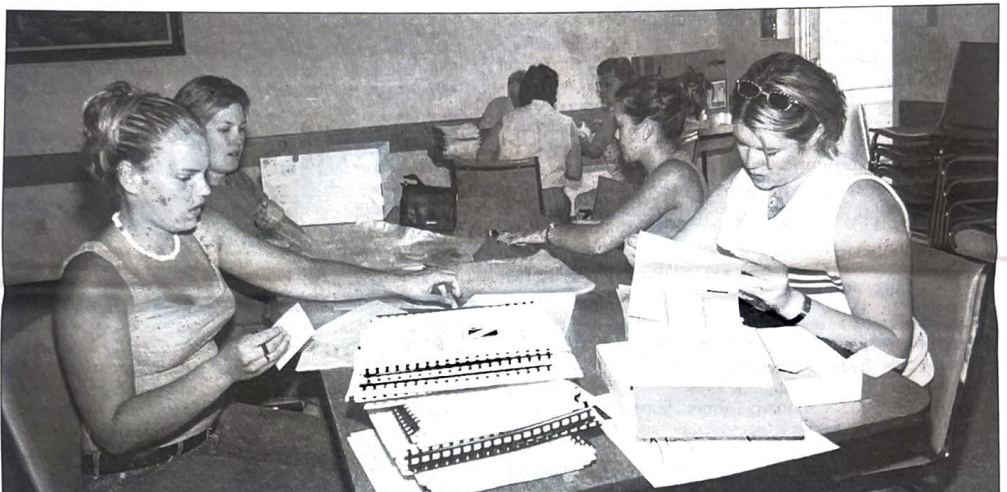
With TransAlta Utilities covering the cost of the front and back covers the anniversary committee was able to keep the cost of the booklets to just \$5 each. Eight volunteers entered the personal and demographic information from the registration forms and three others entered the remembrances and anecdotes.

Becklund said it feels good to have the books published and ready to hand out to all the former staff, students and teachers.

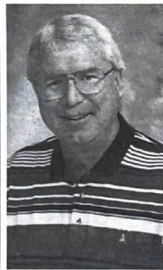

The Chinook Health Region was at the family's farm last week to collect samples of the family's garden produce, water from the nearby irrigation ditch, the house and even the family's store of bottled water.

"We don't know 100 per cent and we might never know," said Vogel. Even if the water proves safe when tested she said there is no guarantee it was OK a week ago.

The Vogel family use irrigation water to irrigate their garden and three days before Caylee

got sick the kids were eating out of the garden.

"It just keeps pointing to the garden," said Vogel.

"I believe in my heart it has to be the water coming down the canal."

She is concerned about the intensive live-stock feeding operations in the region and said all of the dust and flies in the area have to be affecting the health of local residents.

Vogel said she isn't pointing fingers at any one feedlot but would like to see the industry and the county work together to address the health concerns people in the area have.

Coaldale cars hit by thieves

Coaldale police are asking for the public's help in tracking down the person or people responsible for vandalizing six vehicles last week.

In the early hours of Friday morning, a vehicle parked in the 1900 block of Ninth Street had a window smashed, and the culprits gained access to another vehicle on the same street.

Hot Books Club an ongoing success for Coaldale's library

While most things in Coaldale are hot these days, thanks to the sweltering heat, nothing is hotter than the public library's Hot Book Club.

The reading program is designed to help young readers, those in grades 1-3, maintain their reading skills over the summer holiday and pairs older readers with younger ones. The children take turns reading aloud to each other, and when they finish a book, the title of the book and the reader's names get posted on the library's window. The window is so full of colourful construction paper designs, it's almost difficult to see through it.

The kids meet every Tuesday and Thursday morning for an hour and spend the first half hour reading, and the second half hour playing learning games such as Pictionary or sentence structure games.

Coaldale student Kelli Sparks, who is going into Grade 9 at St. Joseph's school, is one of the master readers who helps the younger students improve their skills. This is the second year she has volunteered at the library and says it's an enjoyable way to spend

a couple of mornings a week.

"It's a lot of fun."

On this day, there are many more younger readers than older ones and Sparks is in high demand, reading to two students who will be entering Grade 4 in the fall.

Librarian Sheila Roth says the popularity of the program keeps increasing each year, so much so that the available spaces are quickly filled.

"It is in demand. We have mothers phoning two months before the program starts, wondering when they can start booking."

Bonnie Mikalson is a summer student at the library who organizes the program and the Bugs in Space program. She says the Hot Books Club is plum full with 43 children. The Bugs in Space program has also been very popular this year.

It runs every Wednesday from 2 to 3 p.m. and is a drop-in program for kids entering grades 2 - 6 in the fall.

Each week features stories, crafts and encourages reading and keeping a log book of the summer's reading activity.

Coaldale camp kids clean up

If you've seen a group of kids cleaning the streets and various businesses of Coaldale, that's just the Kids in Motion living up to their name.

The summer camp, which sold out in record time, teaches its 30 wards about working in the community, learning crafts and outdoor activities. The children, who are between the ages of eight and 15, attend the camp either Tuesday/Thursday or Monday/Wednesday, with 15 children at each session.

The camp is run by the Family Ties Association, and this is its first year in Coaldale. It has been successful in other communities such as Taber and Vauxhall, and originated in Calgary about 10 years ago.

The home base for the camp is the basement of the Sportsplex, and every day the children are taught to perform a new chore, which helps keep Coaldale looking spiffy.

"We cleaned up after the demo derby for the fire department. We have cleaned up parks and the highway. A number of businesses have also asked us to perform chores for them," said Stacy Gensorek, the camp leader.

The kids have also made visits to the Sunny South Lodge to play games and sing with the residents.

Crafts are an important part of the camp, and the kids have developed a number of new skills since starting the program in July.

"We've been doing bead work, made piggy banks out of paper maché. We've also made calendars to give out to some of the businesses."

Gensorek is helped by Jami Cook and Arielle Van Der Weide, two practicum students from Lethbridge Community College. Besides doing community service and craft work, the three teach the children life skills, such as responsibility, and how to deflect teasing and bullying.

The extreme heat has had an effect on how long the kids can stay outside, said Gensorek, and she and the other leaders try to limit the outdoor activities to about 45 minutes.

The kids will soon start their fund-raising campaign for their end of the season barbecue. Gensorek said they are planning a car wash at the Coaldale Community Centre, and details will be released at a later date.

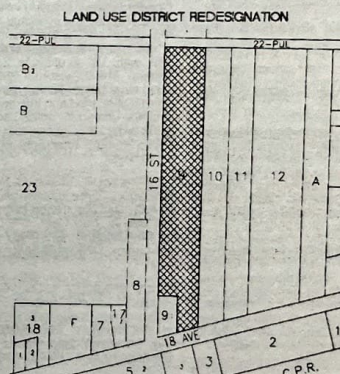

Dryland crops hit by drought

Crop yields may be set for this year's harvest but a good downpour of rain could provide moisture to benefit next year's growing season.

Mike Clawson, special crops specialist, said across the county yields are coming in at about 30 per cent of normal on dryland and slightly above the average on irrigation.

There are some areas that don't look too bad and with a little more rain would have been okay, he said.

In other areas, dryland crops were decimated by the lack of moisture.

Many of the dryland crops have already been written off and cut for green feed in hopes of saving some of the value.

Pasture lands fared the worst in July's hot, dry weather. Clawson said there isn't even enough dryland pasture growth in most cases to measure.

He said most crops across the region have ripened a week or two ahead of schedule with bushel weights on the

light side. This will curtail sales as there is little demand for light barley and wheat.

The heat in July was a reversal of the cool temperatures of May which delayed crops by a week or more.

Crops such as hay, sugar beets, beans and potatoes or enjoying the heat.

Harvesting of seed potatoes in the Cranford area has already begun.

Clawson said the heat will mean heavier sugar beets in the fall but crops like canola, wheat and barley, which favour cooler temperatures, will not be seeing a harvest similar to the last few years.

Clawson said a rain of three inches would have an impact on the dry conditions, but the long-range forecast is not too optimistic.

Dryland in the county is now in an extreme soil moisture deficit and without fall rains farmers will be in the same boat in 2001 as this year.

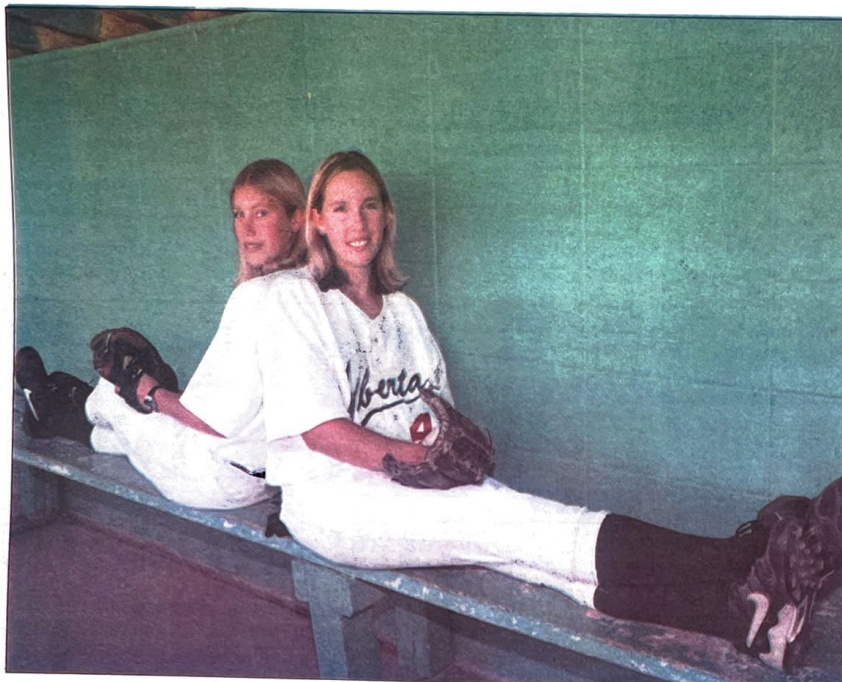
He said chick peas this year proved to be drought tolerant but even in some areas they couldn't hold up to the July heat.

Months of planning and planting made an impact last Monday on the judges of the Communities in Bloom competition.

Roger Belley and Heather Edwards toured Picture Butte to judge the community on the national level of competition. Last year the town won at the provincial level, making it eligible to enter the national division.

County to pipeline city water

There's more than talk coming down the pipeline at the County of Lethbridge these days. Soon there may be water, and plenty of it, for residents of Diamond City, Iron Springs, Shaughnessy and Turin.

County council made its long-awaited decision Thursday to provide the four hamlets with a pipeline from Lethbridge. The line will cost \$3.8 million and construction is dependent on operating approval from Alberta Environment.

"Council feels for the long term this is the best solution for cost-effective, safe, potable water for hamlet residents," said Reeve David Owen.

A preliminary study of the project by MPE Engineering Ltd. estimates the cost of water from Lethbridge would run about \$1.02 per cubic metre.

The project requires funding approval from Alberta Infrastructure and Alberta Agriculture, a water agreement with Lethbridge and commitment from Sunnyrose Cheese factory near Diamond City.

The county was considering either building a pipeline from Picture Butte or Lethbridge, or providing a water treatment facility in each hamlet. A series of open house meetings held in July in the four areas helped council determine that of the residents attending the meetings, an overwhelming majority favoured a pipeline from Lethbridge.

"The open house meetings were very well attended. Of the responses provided, with the exception of Iron Springs, it was clear there was support for the system. The responses also supported a pipeline from the City of Lethbridge," said county manager Layne Johnson.

Belley said a golf course built by volunteers really impressed him. Edwards was also thrilled with the work done by the Prairie Tractor and Engine Society, calling volunteers at the site "real treasures".

The work that has gone into coordinating all of the different beautification and enhancement projects in the community also gained the town bonus points from the judges. Belley said the effort to co-ordinate projects is worthy of mention in the judges' notes.

The fact that Picture Butte has something for all ages from the recently installed playgrounds at Dorothy Dalgliesh for the children to a community center with rooms for the seniors really makes it an attractive town to live in.

Edwards said the commitment to preserving the area's history through the tractor club is also a big plus for the community's overall standing in the judging.

She hails from Saskatoon and has been judging for Communities in Bloom for four years, this being her first year at the national level. Belley lives in St. Albert and has been judging

for three years, two at the national level.

He said he has always been curious about Picture Butte from the time he was a young boy. His father worked for the provincial parks department and had a sign with the town's name on it. He wondered what a Picture Butte was and was excited to come to town and see for himself.

Edwards said the community has really made the most of what it has and continues to co-ordinate efforts between residents and businesses which helps keep projects moving along. As a judge seeing the end result for the first time it looks almost effortless but she realizes there have been hours of work committed to endless projects.

She said Picture Butte has probably the best residential lots she has ever judged. Belley said even in a year with a lack of moisture and water rationing for lawns and gardens, the residents have impressed with their commitment to keeping their properties in good shape.

Both were impressed with the overall tidiness of the town and said they will be taking some of the ideas they have picked up in Picture Butte to

share with other communities in the competition.

Sandy Koenen, who heads up the town's Communities in Bloom committee, found the judges were very positive about everything that has been accomplished in the community. They felt the town could help other communities with ideas that help pull everyone together to raise funds for worthwhile projects.

"They didn't think they'd ever seen a community with as much volunteerism as we have," said Koenen.

The window painting on mainstreet, the planters set up at almost all the businesses in town and the involvement of children in planting projects were just a few of the highlights the judges noted in their tour of the town.

The judges also commended the Shaughnessy Greenhouse for being a part of the whole bloom project in Picture Butte.

In addition to the planters which were purchased by businesses the greenhouse also donated a number of plants to help perk up the town for the competition.

Koenen said she was also impressed with all the town has accomplished through the Communities in Bloom

projects.

"I think Communities in Bloom has pulled the community together in a positive way," she said.

Win or lose, she said Picture Butte can be proud of all it has done especially in a year with extreme heat and a serious lack of moisture.

She hopes now that residents will take ownership in the new flower beds and help keep them cleaned up and looking great.

"Community pride is definitely alive and well in Picture Butte," she said.

Koenen thinks the town did very well in the competition but the awards presentation will not be announced until Sept. 30.

This year the awards will be handed out in Edmonton where more than 700 delegates from across Canada will be attending to hear about all of the communities in the competition at every level.

A slide presentation is made on each of the communities and Koenen said she will be attending not only to pick up any awards Picture Butte may win but also to learn from what other towns and cities have accomplished with their entry in the competition.

City water to supply hamlets

Residents of Iron Springs were not supportive of the pipeline plan. They own their own water co-op and fear the new system will be much more expensive than the current one.

In a letter to council, the Iron Springs co-op requested the pipeline be designed so Iron Springs could join at a later date. Johnson said the details of the plan will be discussed with the Iron Springs co-op, but ultimately the hamlet will be supplied from the new pipeline.

"We want to have a good, positive working relationship with all parties," said Johnson.

Picture Butte opted out of the regional pipeline system in May after working with the county for a year.

The town plans to upgrade its own system, and offered to pipeline its water to the hamlets.

County officials and Picture Butte's town council met recently to

discuss the option, and at county council's meeting last Thursday, Coun. John Kolk expressed concern with the cost proposed by Picture Butte and the quality of water it could provide.

"I have discomfort with Picture Butte's numbers and ongoing discomfort with the quality of water going into Picture Butte," said Kolk.

Coun. Lorne Hickey expressed concern with Picture Butte's potential handling of the water system.


"There is only one person on hand to handle the water. The City of Lethbridge has a 24-hour system and many trained people," he said.

Reeve David Oseen and councillors John Kolk, Lorne Hickey, John Willms and Hans Rutz voted in favour of the pipeline from Lethbridge. Eugene Wauters voted against it. Division 4 Coun. Mark Osaka was absent from the meeting.

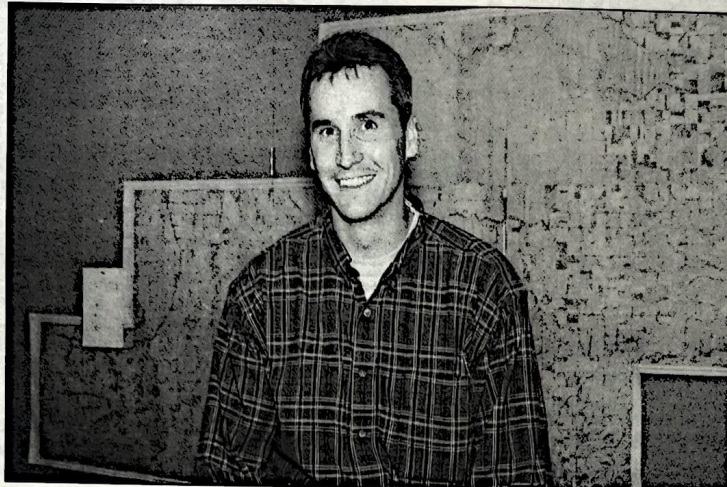
"Experience is one thing they can't teach in school," he says.

Water seems to be on the minds of everyone these days - from the dryland farmers who know that even a lot of rain won't help their wilting crops, to those who live in hamlets wondering where their water pipeline will eventually come from.

The decision has been made by County of Lethbridge councillors, and while they can't control the weather, they do control how Diamond City, Shaughnessy, Iron Springs and Turin and will eventually have a potable water source.

Last week's decision to run a pipeline from Lethbridge to the hamlets is a sound one.

Lethbridge provides good, clean water not only to its 70,000 residents, but also to

Coaldale and rural users beyond who hooked up to the line built to accommodate the McCain Foods (Canada) Ltd. line.

The Walkerton, Ont. tragedy in the past few months, which saw water contaminated with the E. coli bacteria kill up to seven residents, hits home the necessity for each and every community to have a clean water source.

Regardless of where a community's water comes from, quality is extremely important.

Rural users, including the four hamlets and Picture Butte, will have quality water when all the planning and construction is complete.

The expense of the project, and the ongoing costs of water to users will seem like a small price to pay at the end of the day.

While this decision won't make everyone happy, hopefully, a few years from now when all is said and done, people will open up their taps, pour themselves a tall cool one, and toast the county's decision.

A Visser family reunion story

The afternoon of Thursday, July 13, saw us motoring north to Edmonton to spend some time with our kith and kin in Millwoods. The next day, we headed even further north, late in the afternoon, to attend the Visser (my wife's maiden name) reunion at Camp Nakamun, not too far from Westlock. This was the first time in 89 years that this clan was getting together. About 150 folks were in attendance including those well into their 80s and newborn infants. That number is probably half or less of the total number of descendants of Pake and Beppe Visser who immigrated from Anjum (near Dokkum), north-east Friesland in 1911, with four children in tow. Over the span of the last century many, many Friesians have left their province to start new lives and vocations elsewhere in the world but particularly in Canada. This year they had a huge homecoming called Simmer 2000, and all those who had left and their descendants were invited to come back for a visit- Fryslan Boope!

born, one of whom died in infancy and nine children were raised. Four are still alive and were at the reunion with their spouses. Grandchildren came from as far away as North Carolina, California, Saskatchewan and British Columbia but most live in Alberta.

The whole gang always met for devotions prior to any meal and the four surviving siblings and their spouses were in charge of the devotions. The hymns we sang and the passages they read were indicative of an abiding faith, instilled in them by their parents and now evident the third, fourth and fifth generations, even. The variety program on Saturday night saw good participation and gave a pretty good historical overview of the well and woe of the original couple and how they fared. Many interesting tidbits came to light and the various family trees came to life for those in attendance and everyone had a great opportunity to trace one's pedigree, as well.

Pake (grandfather) worked all his life for the Edmonton Water Works and apparently he was a very determined man who did not display a lot of patience but was able to get things done. He was quite involved in helping many people from his old home land get settled in Northern Alberta. Bernard Nieboer, who helped

so many post World War II Dutch immigrants settle in Southern Alberta, knew Tjeerd Visser really well.

Also, he was very supportive of two of his sons who homesteaded north of Barrhead in a thriving farm community now known as Neerlandia. John, my late father-in-law, and his younger brother Raymond, spent many a summer cleaning the required bush, removing stumps and picking roots to create arable acres. John was 15 at the time and his brother a year younger. The year would have been 1927 when this started and Pake would visit his sons during those summer months as often as he could. Beppe stayed with them for part of the first summer.

Pake literally dug a ditch, by hand, to drain one of the sloughs and keep the runoff from flowing across the neighbour's field — we're talking a quarter mile of three feet deep in places and three feet wide at the top to allow the water to make it through a slight hill. His great-grandsons farm that land today and during a wet spring that drain still does the job. Quite a legacy to be proud of for the generations that followed.

The Sunday morning church service put it all in perspective for me, especially as we sang Psalm 68 and the pastor preached on Isaiah 43:18 and 19. Their strong faith empowered them to live fruitful lives that we might do well to emulate as we live our lives. Certainly, we've been shown the way.

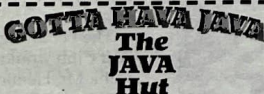

Gun owners attend sessions to obtain licences

The Coaldale fire hall recently played host to the Canadian Firearms Centre where two licensing specialists were on hand to help gun owners fill out the necessary paperwork.

The Firearms Act and Regulations have been phased in starting in December of 1998, and all gun owners have until Jan. 1, 2001 to obtain either a possession licence or a possession and acquisition licence.

A possession licence allows the gun owner to maintain ownership of the gun and purchase bullets.

The fee for this licence is \$10 until Oct. 15, and \$60 starting Oct. 16. The licence is valid for five years.

The possession and acquisition licence allows the licence owner to purchase non-restricted and restricted firearms, and allows for current pos-

session of the firearms.

The fee is \$60 to acquire non-restricted firearms or \$80 to acquire restricted firearms. The licence is valid for five years.

Michelle Snyder, director of communications for Canadian Firearms Centre, said the sessions have been successful, and will run until the end of the summer.

"Even at the Calgary Stampede they were averaging 250 applications a day, which is really a big number because that's completed applications," she said.

A fixed location at Lethbridge's Centre Village Mall will help those who missed the rural sessions.

Seat-belt use still not second nature for rural Albertans

A recent seat-belt safety traffic enforcement campaign by RCMP and local police agencies has helped bring public awareness to the fact that a number of southern Albertans still aren't wearing their seat-belts.

Statistics for the safety blitz, which ran from May 20 to June 17 from Wetaskiwin south to the Montana border, show more than 7,000 drivers were charged for not wearing seat-

belts.

More than 600 adults were also fined for not having their children in proper child passenger restraints.

Coaldale police Chief Doug Hancock says the last couple of road checks completed by Coaldale police showed the number of drivers using seat-belts has increased, but he's not sure if that's indicative of southern Albertans finally getting the message

seat-belts save lives, or if it was due to the fact the force was visible in its campaigns.

"We will continue to keep enforcement of the seat-belt legislation ongoing," said Hancock.

Const. Tamara Aquilini of the Picture Butte RCMP says seat-belt compliance in the area isn't as high as it should be.

"It's improved a bit but not as much

as we'd like. People still think they can drive into town without buckling up and not have an accident. We will continue with our enforcement."

Restraint use has become a top priority for RCMP traffic units as studies continue to show that rural drivers are still the least likely to buckle up.

RCMP statistics show 80 per cent of Alberta's fatal collisions occur in rural areas.

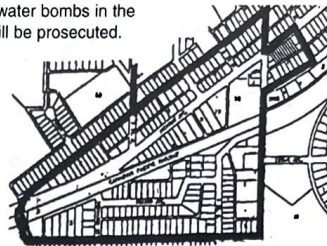

Hose coupling set for August

A number of fire departments from northern Alberta will be represented this month in Picture Butte for the provincial hose coupling competition.

Picture Butte, a 13-time winner of the Murray Bedard Memorial Shield, will host the event Aug. 19 during the town's annual Jamboree Days activities. All competition classes will be run Saturday in

the south parking lot of the high school.

Competition gets under way at 9 a.m. with two events running simultaneously. A number of teams including Olds, Mayerthorpe, Sanquido, Vegreville, Crossfield and Westlock have already confirmed their participation in the competition.

A number of the departments are entering two teams in the provin-

cial competition and one in the fun event. The fun event allows competitors to use a 1.5-inch diameter hose instead of the 2.5-inch diameter hose used in the regular competition.

A representative from the fire commissioner's office in Edmonton will be on hand to run the competition.

All of the trophy presentations and the awarding of the memori-

al shield will take place Saturday evening at the Elks Hall.

Picture Butte's fire department is encouraging other local departments to enter teams in this year's competition. Teams who are interested and want to practice can contact the fire department at 732-4100 and book a time to work with the equipment that will be used for the provincial competition.

Schools busy through summer

Students still have almost a month of summer holidays to enjoy but that doesn't mean schools are empty.

With the school buildings standing vacant for a couple of months Palliser staff and contractors are busy working on renovation and upgrade projects. Facilities supervisor Brian Kranzler said some of the bigger projects include the installation of two new boilers at Noble Central school at a cost of \$90,000.

The school is also receiving one classroom upgrade, a \$5,000 project to install new carpets, chalkboards, tack boards and cupboards. With the arrival of Barons students in the fall there was a need to upgrade the room so it could be used as a classroom.

A \$70,000 project is under way at the Coalhurst high school to construct a perimeter drain to help

keep moisture away from the west end of the school. Due to the high water table in the town, the school has been struggling over the last few years with drainage.

Left unrepaired it could lead to shifting and structural problems with the school. Kranzler said the drain is just the first phase of the project which could be expanded if the water problem is not solved with the initial project.

Carmangay school is receiving a new roof at a cost of \$75,000. Kranzler noted the cost of replacing roofs on school buildings has increased with the jump in oil prices which affects the cost of tar used in roofing.

Picture Butte high school will have a like-new gym floor to welcome in the 2000-2001 school year. Palliser is spending \$40,000 to upgrade the floor which includes cutting away a portion to put in

concrete foundations for the floor sockets which hold the new volleyball standards. The entire floor is also being refurbished.

The front grounds of the school are also being upgraded. Palliser is spending \$15,000 on extensive landscaping. All of the work is expected to be completed in time for the 50th anniversary of the school during Picture Butte's Jamboree Days Aug. 18-20.

Palliser is also spending \$3,000 to \$5,000 to paint all of Arrowwood school. Coalhurst and Jennie Emery schools are both receiving new cupboards, bookshelves and art easels for the new preschool programs.

Preliminary work is also continuing on the new school construction in Coaldale. The current R.L. Baker site has been selected for the new school and plans should be finalized early in the new year.

Millennium family looking for Picture Butte home

Minutes of the Picture Butte town council meeting held in council chambers on Monday, June 26 at 7 p.m. Adoption of the agenda: Moved by Councillor Koenen that the agenda be adopted as circulated. Carried. Adoption of minutes: a) Minutes of the Regular Council Meeting - June 10, 2000. Moved by Deputy Mayor Nemecek that the minutes of the Council meeting held on Monday, June 12, 2000, be adopted as circulated. Carried.

Business arising from the previous minutes: a) Administrative Issues: Administration informed Council, in the Administrator's Report, of the new, ongoing and completed administrative issues from the previous meeting. b) Home for the Millennium Family: Administration has discussed Council's recommendation to house the Millennium Family at the Piyami Lodge with C. Pickering. She has indicated that they would like to have the family and will discuss with her staff a site location that will be safe yet visible to the public. Arrangements will be made to relocate the family as soon as possible. c) Centre Line for Rogers Avenue. Volker Stevin will be in Town in a couple of weeks to paint the centre line down Highway 25 and will do Rogers Avenue at the same time for a cost of \$150 per kilometre. Rogers Avenue is 1.611 kilometres in length, thus the cost will be \$241.65.

d) April Water Sample. Administration discussed the reason for the April 3, 2000 water sample results being returned as "too old" with R. Kurze. He indicated that the wrong date was entered on the sheet that accompanies the water sample. April 3, 2000 was a Monday and the sample was taken on April 4, 2000. Water samples are collected weekly on Tuesdays. e) Gravel on Sidewalk. Administration has been monitoring the gravel on the sidewalk between 454 and 456 Crescent Avenue. We have swept the sidewalk and it appears that some of the gravel is being drug out onto the sidewalk by traffic. Councillor Rudelich noted that his concern was not so much the gravel on the sidewalk, but rather why this alley was selected for graveling and not graded first. Administration was asked to keep this in mind in the future.

f) Sinking Sidewalk at Lion's Park. Rudelich Contracting installed this sidewalk and they will check this sidewalk and report back to Administration as soon as possible. g) Proposed Sidewalk Replacement for 2000. At Councillor Ruaben's request, Council was provided with a list of the sidewalks scheduled for replacement for 2000.

June 15, 2000-Joint Economic Development meeting hosted by Lethbridge and District Community Futures Development Corporation. June 22, 2000-Picture Butte Economic Development and Tourism Meeting. Moved by Mayor Anderson that the report of the Mayor be accepted. Carried.

General Government Services Committee Report: a) Chairperson's Report. Moved by Councillor Ruaben that the report of the Municipal Administrator be accepted. Carried. Councillor Ruaben reported on the following meetings and functions that she had attended: June 13, 2000 - Special Meeting of Council. June 14, 2000 - Water Committee Meeting with the Engineers and Alberta Environment. June 15, 2000 - Joint Economic Development meeting hosted by Lethbridge and District Community Futures Development Corporation. June 21-22-Elected Officials Symposium in Edmonton. Councillor Ruaben will submit a written report to Council at the next meeting. Moved by Councillor Ruaben that the report of the

Chairperson be accepted. Carried.

b) Administrator's Report. Moved by Councillor Ruaben that the report of the Administrator be accepted as presented. Carried. c) Accounts to June 26, 2000. Moved by Councillor Ruaben that the accounts and payroll presented to Council June 26, 2000 in the amount of \$117,764.76 be authorized for payment. Carried. d) May Statement of Current Operating Funds. Moved by Councillor Ruaben that the May Statement of Current Operating Funds be received and filed. Carried.

e) May Statement of Invested Reserve Accounts. Moved by Councillor Ruaben that the May Statement of Invested Reserve Accounts be received and filed. Carried. f) Statement of Revenue and Expenses to June 1, 2000. Moved by Councillor Ruaben that the Statement of Revenue & Expenses to June 1, 2000 be received and filed. Carried.

g) Proposed Discipline Policy Regarding Citizen Complaints. Given the recent number of allegations against staff from the public and the need to investigate such allegations before action is taken, Administration prepare a policy for Council consideration.

The following discussion ensued: Good to set up such a policy and should adopt. Unrealistic to expect citizens not to talk to staff or Council on the street. Should this policy include dealing with verbal complaints rather than having them in writing? Unrealistic to have all complaints in writing as many citizens do feel comfortable talking to Administration. It should be up to Council to bring forward verbal complaints.

Moved by Councillor Ruaben that the Discipline Policy regarding Citizen Complaints be adopted. Discussion followed: To resolve conflict you have to get the two parties together. There have been false accusations in the past that haven't been dealt with properly. Policy won't change the perception that already exists.

This policy may cut off communication with Council. People may be hesitant to put their concerns in writing - protection of privacy. Recommendation that policy include:

"Council upon hearing complaints and allegations should clarify with the accused." Council needs to get both sides of the story. Need to have protocol in place but would like to see verbal complaints somehow included. Perhaps change policy so that complaints may be made in person to either management or Council. Current procedure is acceptable.

Policy intended to support staff and allows staff to respond. Councillor Ruaben requested that her motion to adopt the policy be withdrawn. Moved by Councillor Ruaben that the proposed Discipline Policy regarding citizen complaints be tabled to the July 10, 2000 Council meeting. Carried.

h) Letter from AUMA re: Insurance and Insurance Renewal. Council reviewed a letter from AUMA informing Council that they have negotiated a long-term insurance pricing commitment from ING Welling that can will guarantee both rates and coverage from July 2000 through to Dec. 31, 2001. This long-term policy will avoid three potential premium increases and will match the Town's fiscal year. Administration noted that the premium for this policy, \$32,860, is a reduction of 12.88 per cent over the premium based on the 1999 invoice of \$37,720.

Moved by Councillor Ruaben that the Letter from AUMA regarding the Town's insurance renewal be received and filed and that Administration be authorized to sign acceptance of the insurance renewal. Carried.

i) Proposed Revision to Personnel Policy P.P.F. re: Sick Leave. Participating in the EI Premium Reduction Program can reduce EI premiums for both the employee and the employer. In order for the Town to participate in the EI Premium Reduction Program the integration of Benefits section of the Town's Sick Leave policy must be amended. The existing policy reads: "The sick leave will be reduced by other income benefits as follows: any income replacement indemnity payable as automobile insurance benefits."

The amendment would read: "The sick leave will be reduced by other income benefits as follows: any accident benefits under a provincial automobile insurance plan that does not take income benefits payable by EI into account when paying their benefits." Moved by Councillor Ruaben that the Town participate in the EI Premium Reduction Program and that Personnel Policy PPF addressing Sick Leave be amended to reflect the required revisions. Carried.

i) Staffing Issues. Administration informed Council that there were some staffing issues that she would like to have referred to Committee of the Whole. It was agreed that the following two issues be dealt with as part of the regular Council agenda: i) Letter from G. Secretan re: Staffing. Council reviewed a letter from G. Secretan, Coordinator, Picture Butte High School Employment Project, advising Administration that Picture Butte High School will not be able to work with the Town as an employer for the summer Career Placement project in the summer of 2000 because of the poor condition of the high school baseball field and the attitude of the Town staff. Administration informed Council that she had discussed this letter with J. Watson, Trustee, Palliser Regional Schools and it was agreed that it would be too late in the school year to pull a delegation together for this Council meeting. Administration presented Council with a draft letter in reply to Mr. Secretan's concerns and will request a meeting in the fall with the new principal, vice-principal and this Division's School Trustee to go over the concerns addressed in the letter. Discussion ensued. Moved by Councillor Ruaben that the draft letter as presented be forwarded to Mr. Secretan, under the Mayor's signature, with copies to the Superintendent of Schools, Picture Butte High School Principal and the School Trustee. Carried. ii) Letter from J. Dickout re: Staffing. Council reviewed a letter from local resident J. Dickout regarding her concerns about the public works staffing situation. Discussion ensued: The letter addresses no specific examples. Would like to know what exactly the problems are. Mayor Anderson thought it was quite obvious - the need for a Town Foreman.

Something needs to be done as not only is it frustrating to the citizens, it is frustrating for Council, Administration and the employees. It was noted that the only outside function not getting done was the street sweeping. The garbage and grass is being picked up on a regular basis, the parks and open spaces are in good condition and the water plant is operating successfully.

It was noted that the street sweeping was not completed last year either. Problem is that the staff cannot work independently. Need someone out there with knowledge of the outside operations. Moved by Councillor Ruaben that J. Dickout be sent a reply, signed by the Mayor, thanking her for her concerns and requesting additional information on specific concerns regarding public works. Carried. T. Veltman left the meeting. 7:41 p.m. N. Housenga took over the Recording Secretary duties. Moved by Councillor Ruaben that the other staffing issues be referred to the Committee of the Whole. Carried.

k) Household Guide to Water Efficiency Booklet. Councillor Ruaben questioned if the Household Guide to Water Efficiency booklet had been made available to the Library for local residents to view. Administration replied that a copy had been delivered to the Library. Further, that 50 copies have been ordered for sale in the office. Moved by Councillor Ruaben that the report of the General Government Services Committee be accepted. Carried.

Transportation Services Committee Report: a) Chairman's Report. Chairman Oliver reported on the following meetings and functions that he had attended: June 13, 2000 - Special Council Meeting. June 14, 2000 - Water Committee Meeting. June 15, 2000 - Joint Economic Development meeting hosted by Lethbridge and District community futures Development Corporation. June 20, 2000 - Tender Opening for the 2000 Capital Works Project. Moved by Councillor Oliver that the report of the Chairman be accepted. Carried.

b) Quotation to Repair Raw Water Line. Administration had awarded the raw water line repair at the Regional Park to FMI Contracting for a price of \$912.46. Line locates indicated several lines in the area of the break, therefore FMI was unable to use the backhoe to dig up the line and it had to be dug by hand. The line was located 18 inches below the ground. When the raw water line was exposed it was noted that it had been spliced in four places and that the bolts on one of the clamps had rusted and broke away. The whole section was replaced to eliminate the four splices. Therefore the cost will be less than the quotation. Now that the repair has been completed the road through the Regional Park will be graded and then gravelled.

c) 2000 Capital Works Bid Evaluation and Recommendation. Councillor Oliver reviewed with Council the tender opening for the 2000 Capital Works Project: Five bids were received. The lowest bid was from Top Line Construction in the amount of \$308,376.20. This is

approximately \$31,000 over budget. Bids were higher than anticipated. This is the result of the complicated water valves on 4th Street and the extra work required at the intersection of Sixth Street and Maple Crescent. The cost of the hydrant replacement on Crescent is included in the bid, however the cost of this is included in the 2000 - operating budget. The additional cost to the Town is approximately \$4,600. Completing this project will leave \$983 in Street Improvement funding available to the Town for future projects. Moved by Councillor Oliver that the Town of Picture Butte award the construction contract for the 2000 Capital Works Program to Top Line Construction in the amount of \$308,376.20 subject to Alberta Environment approval of the design drawings. Carried.

d) Proposed Sidewalk Inventory. Council Oliver informed Council that the prioritization of the sidewalk replacement list as presented earlier was not complete. Discussion followed as to if and when the sidewalk replacement would be done. Administration informed Council that the staff had discussed this issue and felt that they would like some instruction on the proper way to lay sidewalk and that she was hoping to have someone work with the outside staff to train them. Discussion ensued on staffing and the qualifications of some of the long term outside employees. It was agreed to refer discussion on staffing to the next planning session on June 27, 2000. Moved by Councillor Oliver that the report of the Transportation Services Committee be accepted. Carried.

Environmental Health Services Committee Report: a) Chairman's Report. Councillor Vance reported on the following meetings and functions that he had attended: June 14, 2000 - Water Committee Meeting. June 20, 2000 - Tender opening for the 2000 Capital Works Project. Moved by Councillor Vance that the report of the Chairman be accepted. Carried. b) Picture Butte Water Treatment Plant Upgrade. i) Minutes of the Picture Butte Water Committee Meeting. Council reviewed the minutes of the Water Committee Meeting held Wednesday, June 14, 2000. Discussion followed: A. Barr faxed the office the following morning with the following change noted in the minutes: Actual cost savings to defer treated water reservoir is \$302,400 not \$560,000 as indicated in the minutes.

Councillor Ruaben indicated that the intent of her comments regarding the Zenon contract for the membranes was misquoted in the minutes and requested that the minutes be amended to read: "Councillor Ruaben asked that since Associated Engineering was dealing directly with Zenon, that they insure that there is adequate insurance and warranty."

The project costs have increased from the 1998 budget price of approximately \$3.6 million to \$3.8 million. The Committee recommended to Council the following potential costs savings of \$394,000 by deferring the raw water pipeline and the lake inlet on the pipeline.

This would provide funding of the required additions for the generator and fire pump, the diffused air system and the relocation of the truck fill. Location of suitable town property for the truck fill. Defer the raw water pipeline and lake inlet until such time as the LNID covers the existing canal. Possible Federal Government infrastructure funding. Moved by Councillor Vance that the minutes of the Picture Butte Water Committee Meeting held Wednesday, June 14, 2000 be adopted as amended. Carried. Moved by Councillor Oliver that the Town defer the raw water pipeline and the lake inlet on the pipeline from the Water Treatment Plant upgrade until the LNID covers the existing canal. Carried. Administration was directed to send a thank you letter to Alan Pentney and Ben Lichtenwald from Alberta Environment for attending the meeting. Also that MP Rick Casson be contacted regarding possible Federal infrastructure funding for the water treatment plant upgrade.

ii) Letter from Associated Engineering re: Insurance Requirements. Council reviewed the letter from Associated Engineering regarding the standard insurance requirements for the contract documents. Discussion followed: That the Town be named as an additional insured and that the Town is the owner.

In response to the letter from Associated Engineering, Council was provided with comments from AUMA regarding the standard insurance requirements for the contract documents. Administration was directed to provide Associated Engineering with a copy of the AUMA review of the insurance requirements. Moved by Councillor Vance that the letter from Associated Engineering and the AUMA comments on the insurance requirements for the contract documents be referred to the next Water Committee meeting for review by the Committee. Carried.

iii) Letter from Associated Engineering re: Membrane Contracts. Council reviewed the letter from Associated Engineering provided a draft copy of the membrane supply and service contract with Zenon Environmental Systems.

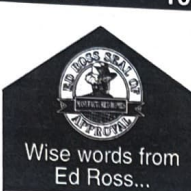

For the first time in its 18-year history the Prairie Tractor and Engine Society's annual Threshing Show will include a church service.

The society's historical display includes the first Christian Reformed Church built in Canada. The church congregation formed in 1905 and then built the church near Monarch in 1907. It was used as a church for several years and then ended up near Champion as a restaurant.

Around the time it was slated to be burned down the society got wind of it and moved it to their site a mile south of Picture Butte. The church arrived in May of 1989 and over the past 10 years it has been worked on by members of the Christian Reformed congregations in the area.

The Kooy brothers from the state of Washington, who attended the church as children and were even married there, have been making the trek to Picture Butte for the last two years to work on the interior and

painting of the church.

The original pulpit and organ have now been installed along with wooden pews. The first church service since the restoration was held July 2 to officially open the building.

Now for the first time the annual Threshing Show, Aug. 19 and 20, will include a worship service. The non-denominational service will be conducted by Henry Heinen.

Society president Leonard Dunn said having a church service works into the whole format of the show, giving visitors an opportunity to attend church on site. Secretary Dick Papworth said it is especially nice for those who are ending on site for the weekend to be able to enjoy a church service if they would like to attend.

The club is now working on generating funds to help upgrade the foundation of the church.

The annual Threshing Show gets under way Saturday with a noon lunch followed by the parade of power at 2

p.m. featuring a host of antique equipment. Throughout the weekend there are binding, stooking, threshing and rope making displays. There will also be an antique tractor pull both Saturday and Sunday.

Saturday draws to a close with a traditional barn dance. Sunday opens with a breakfast from 8 to 10 a.m. fol-

lowed by the church service at 10:30 a.m. and the horse pull at 11 a.m. In addition to the activities and displays, all of the historical buildings will also be open to the public during the show.

Admission is just \$5, breakfast is \$3.50 and children nine and younger are free. There is camping space available and concessions on site.
