love barbecued fish: a salmon steak brushed with maple syrup, a fillet of halibut perfumed with lime or lemon, a whole trout or striped sea bass, stuffed and cooked carefully and briefly over hot coals. Delicious and simple. But not easy because fish is easily overcooked, easily reduced to dried out shreds.

And this is where the Weber Kettle barbecue comes in. It can be used in the conventional way of barbecuing with the fish held in a lightly oiled basket over hot briquets or charcoal. The Weber people call this "direct cooking." But the kettle design also offers the flexibility and creativity of what Weber calls "indirect cooking", with the kettle functioning like a convection oven.

Equal numbers of pieces of charcoal or briquets are arranged on either side of a foil drip tray on the lower grate and then the food is placed on the upper cooking grate over the drip tray rather than directly over the coals. The heat circulates around the food and cooks it evenly and more gently than in regular barbecuing. Since the cooking relies on the heat in the kettle, the lid of the kettle must not be lifted until the cooking process is complete.

It works beautifully with whole fish. I find that both trout and sea bass, each weighing about a pound and a half, work very well. Wash the fish and dry it with paper towels, and then stuff it with the mushroom-vegetable stuffing before baking it in the kettle.

You can dress up the stuffing with thawed crabmeat or fold in a tablespoon or two of small cooked shrimp for special occasions. The sesame salt, which has a special affinity for the mushrooms, is borrowed from Korean cooking. Toast a cup of sesame seeds in a dry pan and then pulverize them in a mortar and pestle with a tablespoonful of coarse salt. If you don't have a mortar and pestle, place the mixture in a plastic bag and pound it with a rolling pin. It should be quite coarse.

Place a piece of heavy tinfoil large enough to enclose the fish generously on a flat surface and rub it with olive oil. Rub the exterior of the fish with olive oil and then wrap it very loosely in the foil so that it is completely sealed. Place the sealed package on the cooking grate over the drip tray and close the kettle.

If you prefer, wrap the fish in large lettuce reaves that have been blanched in boiling was are morent or two and then lay it in a heatered balong dish. Pour about a quarter cup of a de wine over the fish and dot it with small nuts of unsalted butter. Seal the dish with foil and place it on the cooking grate over the drip tray and close the kettle.

Allow ten minutes cooking time for each inch of stuffed thickness. I allow a further ten minutes for the kettle to heat up and for the heat to penetrate the foil and start to cook the fish. A one and a half pound stuffed fish will take about 30 to 40 minutes to cook depending on the heat in your barbecue, and cooked in either of these ways will not dry out.

Chicken is also very good cooked in the kettle placed over the drip tray. Depending on the heat of your barbecue the cooking time should be about 13 to 15 minutes a pound. If the total cooking time is to be over an hour you will have to add additional charcoal or briquets to the lower grate through the handles of the top grate. The chicken will not have the conventional charred taste of barbecued chicken but for additional flavour the kettle works beautifully as a smoker with soaked hickory or mesquite chips on the coals. Or marinate the chicken in an Asian marinade fragrant with ginger and sesame oil.

Potatoes bake beautifully in the Weber kettle. I never wrap them in foil, it steams them

and makes then unpleasantly soggy. I prick them well with a fork, rub them with extravirgin olive oil and put them onto the cooking grate. Cooking time depends on the size of the potato but they should be done in about 40 minutes. Test them by sliding a fork into them and them serve them with mustard butter or mustard sauce.

With either the fish or the chicken, or both, and the crunchy salad, they are delicious!





Mushroom Stuffing

for kettle-baked fish



- · 3 thsp extra-virgin olive oil or vegetable oil
- 1 tbsp sesame salt
- · 4 thsp chopped onion
- · 4 tbsp chopped carrot
- · 4 tbsp chopped celery
- 1 cup fresh breadcrumbs
- 1/2 tsp salt or to taste
 1/2 tsp freshly ground pepper

Note: This recipe makes enough stuffing to fill the cavities of two 1-1/2 lb whole fish.

- 1 Heat the oil in a pan and then add the mushrooms, tossing them quickly in the hot oil. Turn the heat down and allow the mushrooms to cook more gently for a further 5 minutes. Transfer them to a small bowl and sprinkle the sesame salt over them. Set them aside.
- 2 Mix the onion, carrot and celery in a bowl and then stir in the mushrooms, the salt and the pepper.
- 3 Pack the stuffing into the cleaned cavities of the fish and prepare them for baking.



Marinade

for kettle-baked chicken


- 1/2 cup Chinese rice wine
- 4 tbsp light soy sauce
- 3 tbsp fresh ginger, coarsely chopped
- 1/2 tsp salt
- · 2 tbsp sesame oil
- · 2 tbsp extra-virgin olive oil

Note: This is enough marinade for a five to six pound chicken.

- 1 Mix all of the ingredients together and pour them into a bowl large enough to hold the chicken.
- 2 Wash the chicken in cold water and dry it well.
- 3 Pierce the skin of the chicken with the tines of a fork so that the marinade will penetrate through to the flesh.
- 4 Place the chicken in the bowl containing the marinade and marinate it at least overnight and preferably for about 24 hours. Turn the chicken in the bowl from time to time so that the whole bird is marinated.
- 5 Remove the chicken from the marinade about an hour before it is to be cooked and set it aside to air dry.
- 6 Rub the chicken gently with the olive oil and then place it in the kettle to bake.

Helpful Advice: Pre-drill each screw location with a #8 Adjustable Wood Screw Pilot with replaceable drill wherever screws are required throughout the project.

This will avoid splitting and give a clean, professional finish.

- 1 Cut all the individual boards to size. For the handles, transfer the pattern to the lumber. Note: The four top rim pieces may vary slightly depending on the gap you leave between the pieces on the top of the trolley. For this reason, you are better off waiting until the top table pieces are installed before measuring and cutting the rim pieces.
- 2 Score the handle pattern line with a utility knife. This will keep your cut from splintering. Using a jigsaw with a fine wood blade, cut out the handle pieces. Sand each piece of the trolley now when you can easily reach surfaces that become less accessible when the trolley is assembled. Clamp the two handle pieces together and sand as one piece thereby ensuring that both handles match.
- 3 Assemble the upper frame ensuring the four pieces are square. A good way to do this is to measure diagonal comers ensuring that both diagonal distances are the same length. Use two 3 inch #8 deck screws in each comer.
- Assemble the front and back legs. Pre-drill the front legs for the wheel axle. The position of the two holes will depend on the diameter of the wheel you are using. In our cart we used an 8" diameter wheel. Ensure that each leg is square to the top frame. Use a framing square and clamps for this. The clamps will hold the legs in their proper position while you pre-drill two 5/16 inch bolt holes in each leg. Insert a 3-5/16 inch #8 carriage bolt in each hole and tighten using a washer and nut. The legs are positioned on the inside of the upper frame with the bolt head on the outside frame piece.
- 5 Assemble the bottom frame using two 3 inch #8 deck screws in each corner.
- 6 Secure the bottom frame inside the leg assembly to the proper height with clamps. Pre-drill two 3/8-inch bolt holes through each leg and frame section. Insert bolts and tighten using a nut and washer with the bolt head on the outside leg piece.
- 7 Keeping your frame square, screw the ten top table pieces to the frame using 2 inch #8 deck screws. Again pre-drill and countersink each hole. Allow for a 1/2 inch overlap on all four sides as well as a 1/8 inch (approximate) space between each piece.

- 8 Assemble the nine lower shelf pieces using two 3 inch #8 deck screws into the lower frame. The lower shelf pieces should be flush with the outer edge of each leg. Allow 1/2-inch overlap front and back and approximately 1/8-inch space between pieces.
- 9 Cut a 45 degree mitre on the end of each rim piece and assemble the upper tabletop rim. Use a little dab of waterproof wood glue on the end of each of the ten table top pieces and secure the edging into the ends of the table top pieces using a 1-1/2 inch galvanized finishing nail every third tabletop board.
- 10 Install the 1-3/8 inch dowel handle through the predrilled top frame pieces. Pre-drill a 1/8 inch hole up through the underside of each frame piece into the dowel. Secure the dowel handle into the frame by screwing a 2-inch deck screw up into each end of the dowel handle
- 11 Cut the half inch steel rod to the appropriate axle length. The length of the axle will depend on the particular wheel you are using and must be long enough to hold each wheel and end cap. You may have to add washers to the axie inside the wheel to ensure that the wheel does

not rub against the frame. Insert the half inch steel rod axle piece through the pre-drilled holes in the front legs. Place a half inch washer over each rod end snug up against the leg piece. This acts as a spacer so the wheel doesn't rub against the trolley frame. Slide the wheels over the two axle ends and secure by tapping on a half inch cap at each end of the rod.

Note: Our project uses 8" x 1.75" Home Gardener deluxe plastic wheels. We reversed them to keep the wheel from rubbing on the frame leg.

- 12 For a finished look, screw a 2-5/8" wooden contour wheel or some equivalent over each dowel end and cap with a 5/16" round head plug.
- 13 Drill out six holes using a 15/32" drill bit along one side of the upper frame. Tap in 7/8" x 3-1/2" maple shaker pegs using a dab of glue on each of the pegs.
- Earsh cart with a stain of your choice. We sealed ours with a natural sealer and then filled the screw holes with a matching weatherproof sealer.
- 15 Tect on the enjoy!

Need a wall with a window under which to hang a flower box? Here's the easy way to accomplish both, inside or out. This unique piece of garden art not only has great visual appeal, it also acts as a wall trellis for your plants.

Start with an old wooden window frame you find in the garage or at a yard sale. It needn't be a spectacular shape because you are going to dress it up anyway. Taking the glass out, if it's still there, will allow your plants to weave up the frame mullions which act as a trellis.

Following the pattern, build your flower box. The length of your box will be determined by the width of your chosen window frame. Drill two or three holes in the bottom of the box to allow for drainage.

Helpful advice: If you plan to use the box as inside wall art, keep the plants in pots.

You can add a variety of accent pieces to your window box. In one version shown, we added small wooden shutters for extra dimension and fun. If needed, cut them down to the height of the window frame. In the smaller window box, we added a little router detail for interest. You might also want to decorate your window box with a stenciled leaf or flower motif. We also cut out two small cedar brackets (or you could buy them) from the same material as the box. Attach the brackets to the box by screwing two inch #8 deck screws through the bottom of the box into each bracket.

Secure shutters and box to the window frame using three inch T clamps in each corner.

Finishing your window box: We chose to leave the frames in their original weathered state, but you can stain or paint them if you wish. In the shutter version, we used two complementary stains for the box and shutters.

In the smaller version, we left the cedar natural, sealing it with a clear, exterior sealer.



Butterfly House

- 1 Cut sides, back, front, partition, top and base from clear or #1 cedar. The wood used in the project is commonly available in finished stock measuring 5/8" thick by 5-1/4" wide. Cut angles on the front and back of the top (roof) piece, and on the tops of the back and front pieces to accommodate the roof slope. A slope of 22-1/2 degrees was used in this project. More or less slope will change the dimensions of the front and side sections, as well as the partition. Some slope is necessary in order to shed water, and the roof overhang helps shield the slotted front from the weather

Cut the verticle 5/16" slots in the front piece using a router or jigsaw, and a clamped straightedge as a guide. Drill a 5/16" hole first at both ends of each slot if using a jigsaw.

Note: Pre-drill each screw location with a #8 adjustable Wood Screw Pilot Drill

- 2 Attach the partition to the back with two 1-1/2" deck screws.
- 3 Attach the sides to the back using three screws in each panel, then attach the front panel to the sides, using three screws into each side panel.
- 4 Attach the bottom panel with four screws.
- 5 Using the hinges, attach the roof panel. This lets you observe activity in the butterfly house. Ensure that the roof closes tightly at all sides.
- 6 Insert long pieces of tree bark into the two partitioned sections.
- 7 Seal, stain or paint the finished butterfly house, or leave the cedar to weather to a grey colour.
- 8 Mount the butterfly house within 6 feet of the ground in a sheltered location, facing away from prevailing winds. Bottom mounting can be facilitated using a metal "floor flange" for pipe, or the house can be fastened to a fence, tree, etc. by pre-drilling and screwing through the back section under the opened roof.

Butterflies Home Gardening

Endlessly fascinating for people of all ages, butterflies embody freedom and beauty. Although their habitats vary from deep woods to meadows, from wetlands to city gardens, they just as often appear along dusty roadsides and even on busy city streets. While study of these marvelous insects has grown rapidly over the last few years, appreciation of their splendor and concern for their welfare is not a new or current trend. In the 19th century, English land owners were encouraged to grow host plants for the butterfly caterpillars, and let sections of their estates grow wild to provide a suitable environment for these enchanting creatures.

Flowers and plants are an integral part of the butterfly's life cycle. Adult butterflies assist plants through cross pollination, and the plants provide food and homes for the butterflies in their various stages of growth This mutual dependence is known as a symbiotic relationship.

The Sutterfly Garden

The easiest way to observe butterflies is to invite them into your garden. Butterflies like flowers with large colourful blooms and suitable nectars. The blossom's colour and scent alert butterflies to the plant's presence and nectar, which provides the food energy they need for flight.

Some butterflies will visit almost any available blossom, while others are much more selective. The greater the variety of flowering plants, the better your chances of attracting a variety of butterflies. Plan the garden for continuous blooming throughout the growing season, with the emphasis on protected sunny areas. Red, orange and yellow blossoms provide the highest interest. Butterflies see more of the violet end of the light spectrum than we do, and are drawn to mauve and purple as well.

Follow the rules for basic garden design regarding colour mixes, relative heights of plants, growth rates, blooming sequences and duration of blooming. Be realistic about the planting space available, and limit your choices. Choose plants suitable for your planting zone and include as many native plant species as possible. Ideally, place your butterfly garden where it can be viewed

without disturbance, near a garden bench or kitchen window, for example.

Butterflies are also attracted to moisture. and they may often be observed at the edge of puddles or on wet sand taking in the water with its dissolved salts and minerals. A bird bath or water garden will enhance the chances of butterfly visits, particularly swallowtails and sulfurs.

Make a bait for butterflies, made of partially fermented sugar in some form. Combine brown sugar or molasses with overripe fruit (bananas or peaches work well). A small amount of rum or stale beer speeds the fermentation process. Paint the resulting paste on a tree or fence post on the side away from the wind or pour it on a damp sandy area (keep it moist). Choose the spot carefully. since it may also attract other unwelcome nocturnal visitors. Keep the bait away from areas frequented by children and household M. After dark, visit the spot with a flashlight to observe any night flying Lepidoptera (moths). Your garden doesn't sleep at night!

A Butterfly House

Bird houses have long been common to many gardens, and bat houses have become popular recently. Why not a house for butterflies? It acts as a winter sleeping cabin for those butterflies that hibernate, where natural materials inside the shelter, such as pieces of tree bark, offer an area to 'roost' or latch on while waiting out the cold winter weather. Although some species of butterflies such as the monarch migrate as adults, others, such as anglewing, mourning cloaks and tortoiseshell will hibernate in hollow logs, stumps or other areas which provide shelter from the weather and winter predators. The first butterfly in the spring may well be a mourning cloak, emerging from hibernation while snow is still on the ground.

A butterfly garden is a shared pleasure for both the gardener and its visitors. If you provide the nectar sources, the butterflies will come, as will hummingbirds and a host of other insects. The more one observes the diversity of life within the confines of an outdoor garden, the greater the appreciation that exists for the small things living and visiting there.

Growing a Giant Sunflower

With giant velvety leaves, towering green stems, enormous daisy-like yellow flowers and bountiful harvests of tempting, tasty seeds, sunflowers are definitely fun flowers to grow from beginning to end! What's even better is they are the perfect plant for your own little sprout to nurture.

Select a wind-sheltered site with full sun. Prepare the soil by letting your young gardener dig in a couple bags of Home Gardener composted manure or a wheelbarrow load of garden compost. After the danger of frost has passed, plant the seeds about six inches apart and a half inch deep. In areas with shorter growing seasons, start the seed indoors two to three weeks before the normal outdoor planting time. By the way, the best variety for towering behemoths is called Mammoth Russian. Once the seeds have sprouted, thin them out until the remaining ones are about two feet apart.

Feed sunflowers every two weeks with a 15-30-15 water soluble fertilizer or every six weeks with a granular blood and bone meal mix. Keep the soil cultivated around the plants and make sure they get plenty of water all season long - it's the key to getting large seed heads! Have some stakes handy for later in the season in case the seed head gets too heavy and starts to pull the plant over. And watch out for jays and squirrels as they just love the seed! There is a great interest in growing sunflowers and many fall fairs right across the country have contests for the tallest. Maybe this year, yours will be a winner!

A Watering Stop for the Birds

Peeding wild birds is an enjoyable activity for young and old alike any time of year. While wild birds have preferences for various types of food, they all need water. If you provide them with a watering stop, you will see an increase in the activity and variety of wild birds in your yard!

Wild birds need secure footing around water so avoid using structures that have slick surfaces. If you cannot avoid them, layer in a few partly submerged flat rocks, pieces of wood or twigs is make the spot more bird friendly. Many wild birds also have an inherent fear of deep water. A maximum depth of two to three inches is best, with a gradual slope to the deepest point. A minimum diameter of two to three feet will allow numerous birds to share the spot at any one time.

Keep the water open year round as fresh water can become quite scarce in many parts of the country during winter. In areas with freezing temperatures, use a submersible bird bath heater to keep the water from freezing. Regularly clean the structure and always make sure the water is fresh.

Bathing birds can be easy targets for predators, so keep elevated birdbaths at least three feet above ground level. For the same reason, situate low level watering spots in open areas about 15 feet away from the nearest cover.


The sound of moving water is extremely appealing to birds with gentle sounding drips, tinkles and gurgles their favourites. One of the easiest ways to achieve sound effects with bird appeal is to take a bucket and punch a very small hole in the side about a half inch up from the bottom. Fill the bucket with water, place a lid on it, then hang it three to five feet above the watering spot. The slow drip will produce gentle bird attracting sounds for hours.

helpful advice

You can create simple bird baths from a hollowed out stump, a shallow hole in ground lined with plastic, even a garbage can lid weighted with stones.



round water resources are being taxed J to the limit by increased demand in many parts of the country, particularly during summer. In fact, it has been estimated that up to half of the water used in summer goes onto lawns and gardens! In some cases, demand has threatened to outstrip supply with the end result being the implementation of water use restrictions. While the solution is complex, I believe one simple part of the answer is to increase the capture and use of rainwater as a supplemental source of irrigation.

The most convenient way to capture rain water for smaller properties is with the use of rainbarrels placed on elevated platforms under down spouts. Where space allows, storage capacity can be increased by connecting several rainbarrels together. Keep lids on the barrels to help prevent mosquito infestation and to reduce evaporation. For larger rural properties, direct run-off from the roofs of homes and barns into cisterns, tanks or ponds. Connect a gas or electric powered pump to these reserves and drive your own irrigation system.

Some water saving techniques:

- · Mulch exposed soil to reduce evaporation and water run-off.
- As much as possible, avoid growing water loving plants in naturally dry climates.
- Use drought tolerant plants on south facing slopes.
- · Water early in the morning to help reduce evaporation.
- · Build small soil berms around water-loving plants to help trap water.
- · Plant leafy vegetables in squares rather than
- Use a drip irrigation system.
- · Plant trees as windbreaks.
- . Increase the organic matter content of the soil by adding a sport or manures.
- . If you do water your lawn, water it heavily (let one in a) once a week rather than a small aucunte hiday.



Home Gardening White Grubs a hidden menace

he term white grub is a catch all name for the whitish coloured, C-shaped, soil inhabiting larvae of the scarab beetle family. While many are harmless, a few are major pests due to their preference for feeding on the fibrous roots of turf grasses. The most obvious stage of these insects are the large adult beetles often seen swarming around trees at dusk during May or June. Unfortunately, it is usually the hidden larval or "white grub" stage that causes the most destruction.

June beetles, which follow a three year life cycle, are the most common and widely spread group in this family. While damage is often spotty, it can be extensive on lawns in the second summer after a heavy flight of adults. Adults feed on the foliage of certain trees and shrubs and can cause damage if they are present in large numbers. The European chafer, which is common in the southern half of Ontario and has made inroads into parts of southern Quebec and Nova Scotia, has a one year life cycle. When present in sufficient numbers, the larvae can cause extensive damage to turf during the late summer and fall, particularly in times of drought. The Japanese beetle, present in the Niagara peninsula and extreme southwestern Ontario, also completes its life cycle in one year. The larvae can cause extensive damage to turf while the shiny metallic green adults feed ravenously on the foliage and fruit of a wide range of plants.

White grubs directly damage turf grasses by feeding on the roots. Turf grasses with reduced root systems die off rapidly when heat, drought and/or winter stresses occur. Areas of the lawn that are continually under stress, such as sunny hillsides, drought prone spots and compacted areas normally show the damage first. The presence of grubs indirectly leads to furnish carnage during the fall, winter and spring Animals such as skunks and moles, can absolute and desiroy what is left of the turf by foraging for the grubs.

To tell if browning in the lawn is caused by

grubs, simply pull on the affected grass. Turf that lifts up like a piece of loose carpet is a pretty good indication that grubs are active. The time of year that damage begins to show is also important. Since adults are out in May, June and/or July, damage from grubs normally doesn't show until August. Since it is easier to kill white grubs when they are small, make treatments as soon as any confirmed damage starts to show or when monitoring indicates one is required. To monitor grub numbers, peel back several small sections of turf in early August and count the number of grubs you find. If there are six or more per square foot and you do not irrigate the lawn, a treatment will probably be necessary. Regularly irrigated lawns can withstand up to 20 white graps per square foot before treatment is required.

Cultural control: Keep grass healthy and actively growing. Water regularly, feed the lawn at least twice a year, de-thatch once a year and raise the mowing height during periods of drought. Where water stress is a problem switch to more drought tolerant grasses such as fescues and perennial rye grasses. In areas that are consistently damaged consider switching from grass to other types of ground cover plants with sturdier root systems.

Organic control: Beneficial nematodes are microscopic organisms that actively search out and consume the soil inhabiting larval stages of many insects, white grubs being one of them. Pheromone traps are an effective control for adult Japanese beetles.

Chemical control: Three chemicals are registered for domestic use: Sevin (liquid, dust), diazinon (liquid, granular) and chloropyrifos (liquid, dust, granular). Diazinon and chloropyrifos are the most common choices. In all cases, the insecticide MUST be thoroughly watered in immediately after application. Do not allow spray treatments to dry out before watering in as they will fix onto the grass blades and rapidly break down in the sun. It is best to treat lawns with insecticides after a period of rain or inigation as soils that are moist beforehand allow the chemical to move more effectively into the soil the rone of the grass.

Tips on Buying Perennials

Here's how to get the most for your dollar when you invest in the wonderful world of perennial plants:

- 1 Unless you are quite familiar with perennials, do not purchase plants without identifying labels. Tags or labels often contain information on growing conditions and plant size that is valuable for helping you choose the right plant for the right spot.
- 2 Purchase two year old plants or crowns as many perennials will not flower very well in their first year of growth. The exception is when you plan to use perennials as groundcover in large areas. In this case, purchase seeds, rooted cuttings or year old plants — it's far cheaper!
- 3 While it is tempting, try to avoid purchasing plants already in flower. Instead go with smaller, healthy looking plants that have yet to flower as they will be better able to establish themselves in your garden before having to cope with the stress of flowering.
- 4 Look for these signs that indicate the plants are healthy and have been well cared for: evenly coloured leaves, bushy compact growth, potting mix that is well watered and an absence of insect damage such as discoloured leaves, stunted growth or chewed stems or leaves.
- 5 Flip potted plants over, tap the pot lightly, gently slide the root ball out into your hand and visually check for healthy abundant roots.
- 6 Gently squeeze the crown of perennials sold as either bare root or in carded bags. If it is mushy, slimy, hard or brittle, pass it by.
- 7 When in doubt, count on the knowledgable staff at your local Home Hardware Garden Centre.

Planting Perennials

While each perennial is unique in its own way, there are a few general planting tips to keep in mind that will minimize transplanting shock and help to ensure success.

- Before planting, especially in sandy or clay soils, work in large amounts of composted manure, peat moss or garden compost, eight to 12 inches deep. Add a small amount of phosphorus fertilizer to encourage rapid rooting after planting.
- To protect tender roots from drying out, do not remove perennials from their containers until it is time to plant them. When removing perennials from nursery containers, water them first. That will let them come out of their pots more easily and with less root damage.
- With a taw expensions, perennials should be planted with their streets at the same depth as they were in their streets containers. To reduce


heat stress (to both you and the plant!) plant early in the morning or in the late afternoon.

- For large-rooted perennials, dig the planting hole about a spade's width wider than the root ball.
 Spread the major roots out carefully, then add the soil back in, firming down as you go.
- Water thoroughly and deeply after planting, to settle the soil around the roots and to remove air pockets. After this initial watering, water only when the plant starts to wither slightly.

A few more tips:

- Do not crowd perennials. This may cause disease and poor performance.
- Avoid over-fertilizing. This can lead to rampant growth and poor flowering.
- Avoid frequent, shallow watering. Water less often but for longer periods to encourage deep rooting.

Do you need a new roof? Ask the



Chingles have a predictable life-span, which is influenced by several conditions.

They include:

- · Poor ventilation, which causes excess heat in the attic in the summer.
- Damage from ice build-up, wear of tree branches, and foot traffic on the roof especially in hot weather.

A visual inspection of your roof every year is part of a general preventative maintenance program. This inspection will also help you to gauge whether your roof is due for replacement. Look for the following indicators:

- Blistering, distortion, many broken tabs, curling of asphalt shingles. Winter curling sometimes affects asphalt shingles. The effect is noticeable with all shingles, depending on shingle age, attic ventilation, shingle type, roof pitch, humidity, etc. Although the shingle curling is visible during cold weather, the shingle's durability and water- shedding performance are not affected, and the shingles will lay flat again with the return of warm weather.
- · Bare spots of coating asphalt exposed on the surface of the shingles. Some "hitchhiker" granules will come off the shingles over the first 2 years of a new roof, but this is normal, and in no way affects in the weather-proofing life of the shingles.

The granular colour of your roof may fade over time, but this has little impact on the protection value of your roof. The changes are just to the surface coating applied to the granule particles only.

Do you need to strip off old shingles or can you reroof over them?

There are no easy answers but here are a few general guidelines:

Tear off existing shingles if inspection reveals:

- · Rolled or warped roof boards.
- · More than two layers of shingles already on the roof.
- . If existing roof is so rough that another layer would not lay flat.

In most cases, it is not necessary to tear off the old shingles if they are staying relatively


flat and the wood decking is in good condition. Two more benefits to leaving the old layer of shingles: it will provide a secondary back-up roof for the new shingles and you'll save the cost and inconvenience of removing and disposing of the old ones.

Proper Ventilation

Proper ventilation of the attic area is important for several reasons:

- To ensure maximum life out of building materials used in roof assembly.
- · Improved heating and cooling costs. It is critical to provide proper ventilation to ensure free and unobstructed air movement beneath the roof surface.

The vents should be uniformly distributed on opposite sides of the roof, providing 1 square foot of ventilation for each 300 square feet of insulated ceiling area (150 square feet for low sloped roofs or cathedral ceilings).



Installing a Plastic or Rotary Turbine Roof Vent

From inside your attic, choose a location that is unobstructed by framing, and hammer a nail up through the roof. This will indicate the location of the hole to be cut on the outer surface of the roof.

Mark an opening the same size and shape as the vent opening (throat). Remove the nail, and after drilling a starter hole for the blade, cut out the opening with a jigsaw.


The roof vent slides under the two shingle courses above the vent, and lies on top of the bottom courses. Carefully lift the tabs of the shingles around the vent area with a super bar, similar to a pry bar, and remove any roofing nails preventing placement of the vent. A super bar is also very useful in removing roofing nails when replacing damaged shingles. Use a utility knife with a hooked blade to cut away any shingle material that prevents the throat of the vent from sliding up into position over the precut hole.


Nail a roofing nail through each of the four corners of the vent flange. Carefully he the shingle tabs to access the upper two corners.


Re-seal any shingle tabs that were raised during installation using a caulking gun and a cartridge of roofing cement, pressing each shingle firmly in place. Apply a bead of appropriately coloured acrylic caulking to the vent flange where it meets the shingles.



Pot Belly Pigs

Clay creatures are popular in garden décor. Create your own family of Garden Hogs, to nestle in your flora.

what you'll need

- clear silicone glue 2031-223
- wire (pig tails) 2647-700
- clay pots 8 3" 5059-642 (legs)
- 1 5" saucer 5057-467 (snout)
- 1 6" saucer 5067-478 (snout)
- · rusted metal for ears
- 2 10" 5059-697 (body)

Optional: Cut ears from dryer vent with the faux rust applied on the metal.

(Pick up your Metal Effects brochure on rust, available at your local Home Hardware).

- 1 Glue the two large pots together with silicone glue. Let dry.
- 2 Top of leg: Glue four of the 3" pots into place. Let dry.
- 3 Bottom of leg. Place glue around the bottom edge of pots. Insert into top of leg. Slant the pot, allowing your hog to stand straight.
- 4 Glue saucers into place for snout.
- 5 Curl wire for tail. Glue into place.
- 6 Cut ear shape from metal, glue into place.

NB: You can create different sizes of garden hogs, by using larger or smaller pots.

Optional: Head pot may be 1" smaller than body pot for a different effect.







1 Prepare concrete according to directions. Only mix what is needed.

- 2 Pour into form; jiggle or vibrate to get rid of the air bubbles.
- 3 Check to see when concrete is set enough to put design in. The resurfacing concrete will be less than 30 minutes. The concrete mix takes approximately half an hour to an hour. Time will vary depending on temperature and humidity.

Tips on Concrete:

- 1 To increase concrete strength, slow drying time with a wet cloth after it has set.
- 2 Work the surface with a trowel to push larger stones to the surface.
- 3 (Concrete Mix) Lightly vibrating the concrete while it is wet releases bubbles and floats surface smooth.


